
LOPEZ HILL PRESERVE

Lopez Island



Quiet, 400-acre **Lopez Hill** supports an expanse of mature conifer forest, as well as seasonal wetlands and rocky meadow openings. Over four miles of trail are open to pedestrians, equestrians, and mountain bikers. Limited deer hunting is also permitted; hunters must contact the Land Bank for current regulations. There is parking for 4 vehicles. Originally owned by the Washington State Department of Natural Resources, the Land Bank negotiated a 50-year lease in 2009 to manage the property for its ecological and recreational values. In 2018, the Land Bank purchased the property outright. The local group Friends of Lopez Hill (www.lopezhill.org) built and maintains trails on the property, and was also instrumental in securing the Land Bank lease. A detailed trail map is available from Friends of Lopez Hill.



Directions

From the Lopez ferry landing:

Take Ferry Road heading south. At 2.2 miles, turn left onto Center Road. At 6.45 miles, turn left onto School Road. At 7.55 miles, take a sharp right onto Lopez Sound Road. At 8.8 miles, turn right onto the bumpy gravel entry road., which ends at the parking area, at 9.0 miles from start.

From Lopez Village:

From the water tower at Village Park, go east on Lopez Road for .25 miles. Turn right onto Fisherman Bay Road. Turn left onto Hummel Lake Road at .30 miles. Turn right onto Center Road at 1.1 miles. At 3.4 miles, turn left onto School Road. At 4.5 miles, take a sharp right onto Lopez Sound Road. At 5.75 miles, turn right onto the bumpy gravel entry road, which ends at the parking area, at 5.95 miles from start.
