

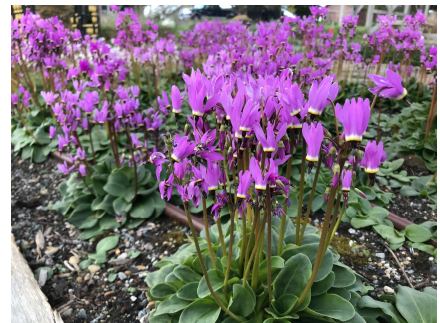


## How to order plants from the Salish Seeds Project

The Salish Seeds Project grows and sells plants native to San Juan County grasslands, oak savannahs, and meadows. There are two ways to order plants:

1. **Native Plant Sale Events.** Salish Seeds Project plants are available to the public during an annual Fall Native Wildflower Sale in September/October. Sometimes there is an early spring sale as well. Ordering is online with in-person pick-up on multiple islands. These sales feature wildflowers and grasses in 4" pots, bulbs, and seed packets. There are no minimum purchase amounts.
2. **Special Orders.** Anyone is welcome to place a special order from the list below. *Please note minimum quantities.* Species marked with an asterisk are best ordered by October 31 to ensure availability the following summer or fall. Other species can be ordered by March 31 for pick-up that same summer or fall. To place an order, contact Eliza Habegger at the San Juan County Land Bank ([elizah@sjclandbank.org](mailto:elizah@sjclandbank.org); 360-370-7653) with a list of species and quantities desired. Most special orders are for plugs (see photos below) as we have limited space for larger pot sizes. Sometimes we can arrange to delivery special order to other islands, but in general we ask that you plan for pick-up at our facility on San Juan Island.

Don't hesitate to ask if you're seeking a plant that's not on the list below or need help planning your project. Surplus plants may occasionally be available for purchase – it never hurts to ask.
