



How to order plants from the Salish Seeds Project

The Salish Seeds Project grows plants native to San Juan County grasslands, oak savannahs, and meadows. Plants are used for San Juan County Conservation Land Bank habitat restoration projects. They are also sold to San Juan County residents, landowners, and land conservation partners. There are two ways to purchase plants:

1. **Native Plant Sale Events.** Our annual Fall Native Wildflower Sale in September/October is designed for gardeners, landowners, and other islanders seeking relatively small amounts of plants. The sale features wildflowers and grasses in 4" pots, bulbs, and seed packets. Ordering is online with in-person pick-up on multiple islands. There are no minimum purchase requirements.
2. **Special Orders.** Special orders are for plugs and bulbs and are intended for restoration projects or larger garden/landscape projects. To place a special order, contact Eliza Habegger at the San Juan County Land Bank (elizah@sjclandbank.org; 360-370-7653) with a list of species and quantities desired. Plants can be picked up in summer or fall at our nursery facility on San Juan Island.

The species we routinely grow for special orders are listed on the following page. *Please note minimum order quantities.* Plugs are sold by the tray (98 plugs per tray). We can sometimes grow additional species if seed is available or provided by the orderer. Species marked with an asterisk generally take a year or more to grow and should be ordered as far in advance as possible. Other species can be ordered by March 31 for pick-up that same year.
